
The first African slaves were brought to Jamestown, Virginia,
in 1619.



The Southern people needed slaves to work on their large plantations. The slaves were treated like animals and were not allowed to have basic human rights.




Some white people did not like slavery and believed that the slaves should be freed. In 1861, when Abraham Lincoln was president, a war broke out between the people of the North, who believed slavery was wrong, and the people of the South, who depended on slaves to tend their fields.




The North won the Civil War. The 13th Amendment was added to the United States Constitution making slavery illegal. Slaves were freed in 1865.
